SpokerRide 2015– 7/25/015 Information and Rules

The SpokerRide is a charity event, all proceeds are donated to the Livestrong foundation (www.livestrong.org) and the American Cancer Society (www.cancer.org). The ride starts and ends in Sackets Harbor, NY. The courses are generally flat, with some hills. There are *two* courses, a *30 mile* (beginner/ intermediate) course, and a *50 mile* (advanced) course. A novice course is available for those riders that want to participate but not race. (race lengths are estimated—depending on road conditions on the day of the race)
